Characterized by techniques such as graph analysis, simulation, complex event processing, neural networks, recommendation engines, heuristics, and machine learning, Armorway's solution is in the same category that industry analysts define as a form of advanced analytics which examines data or content and advises actions for desired predictable outcomes.

In February, Armorway introduced Trust™ which joins Armorway Sentinel™ as part of the company's patented AI technology platform that improves an organization's proactive response to active incidents. Trust™ turns routine internal security checks into reliable threat detection and deterrence, enabling organizations to become more proactive against insider threats, including data theft and physical crime.
